College Level Examination Program (CLEP)

#### What is CLEP?

CLEP is a series of computer-based examinations that allow individuals to earn college credit for what they know, regardless of where they learned it. CLEP is the most widely accepted credit-by-examination program in the United States.

CLEP examinations are 90 minutes long. With the exception of College Composition, the exams are composed of two sections of multiple-choice questions. The College Composition exam consists of a multiple-choice section and two essay sections.

#### What you should do before taking a CLEP exam?

Enclosed is a list of the CLEP exams, scores and course equivalents for Cal U. You should speak with your academic advisor prior to taking an exam to ensure that the exam is accepted for your program of study.

Thirty (30) credits is the maximum a student can earn through CLEP and/or DSST.

#### **Cost and Special Policies**

Cost per exam is \$89 payable by credit card (MasterCard, Visa, American Express or electronic check. Payment is to be made PRIOR to testing through the "My Account" portal at <a href="http://clep.collegeboard.org">http://clep.collegeboard.org</a>.

#### Examinees with disabilities:

- Will present the Accommodation Approval Notice to the Placement Testing Center Administrator when requesting accommodations that involve testing.

Examinees are expected to adhere to the procedures for self-identifying, providing documentation and requesting accommodations in a timely manner.

### On the Day of Testing—You will need:

- One (1) form of government-issued photo ID with signature (Driver's License, Passport or current Military ID).
- Registration ticket printed from "My Account" portal through CLEP.

#### Test Results

You will receive instant score reports, except for the College Composition exam.

#### Life Experience Fee

Once you pass an exam, you will receive an email with a link to pay the Life Experience Fee. This fee of \$25 is a one-time fee payable to CAL U to have the credits placed onto your transcript. You may pay by credit card or electronic check.
